A. Orientation to college teaching and student learning	<ol> <li>Documentation of least eight hours of departmentally-based GSI training which must include practice teaching and a classroom climate session (sometimes offered as a 1-credit 993 course)         <u>OR</u> </li> <li>Successful completion of ELI 380 or ELI 994 (ELI 994 also satisfies Requirement B)         <u>OR</u> </li> <li>Attendance at an entire CRLT Graduate Student Instructor (GSI) Teaching Orientation or Engineering GSI Teacher Training program.</li> </ol>
B. Learning about teaching	<ol> <li>Successful completion of one of the following U-M courses on college teaching:         <sup>1</sup> EEB/MCDB 494, MUICOL 509, ENGR 580, ROMLANG 538, ROMLING 528, GERMAN 531,         PIBS 505, ED 720, ED 790, ED 737 (selected sections<sup>2</sup>), ED 834, HIST, 812, BA 830&amp;831,         AAPTIS 837, PSYCH 958, SWC/WRITING 993 (Fall 2012 and later), ELI 994 (<i>ELI 994 also satisfies Requirement A</i></li></ol>
C. Instructional practice	<ol> <li>Two terms of teaching at U-M<sup>4</sup>, as certified by a course supervisor or GSI supervisor. This teaching must include direct contact with students in a classroom, studio, lab or equivalent setting. <i>Positions involving only grading and/or office hours will not fulfill this requirement.</i> <ul> <li>AND</li> </ul> </li> <li>One of the following consultations on teaching at U-M: Midterm Student Feedback, classroom observation, classroom videotaping, or consultation on student ratings<sup>5</sup></li> </ol>
D. Mentorship on teaching	Participation as a mentee in a faculty mentorship on teaching, with a U-M faculty member (2-3 meetings) or with a faculty mentor elsewhere (such as through the Rackham-CRLT Mentorship Program). The mentorship must include an endeavor above and beyond preparation to teach courses to which GSIs are appointed. Examples include, but are not limited to: (1) design, present, and receive feedback on a guest lecture, (2) prepare a syllabus, instructional materials or assignments for a future course, or (3) conduct a research project on teaching and learning. <sup>6</sup>
E. Reflection on instructional practice	Completion of a 2-page statement of one's teaching philosophy <sup>7</sup>

<sup>1&</sup>quot;Successful completion" is defined as a B grade or better or a "Satisfactory (S)" grade in a pass/fail course. One-credit courses on college teaching, such as 993 courses, (except Writing 993 Fall 2012 and beyond), do NOT satisfy Requirement B, but may satisfy Requirement A (see criteria above). As CRLT becomes aware of additional comprehensive U-M courses on college teaching (usually 3-credit, semester-long courses), they will become eligible to be added to the list for requirement B1. The U-M Graduate Teacher Certificate Advisory Committee will review petitions each November and March. To submit a letter of petition, send an e-mail and the course syllabus to UMGraduateTeacherCertificate@umich.edu. The Advisory Committee recommends that courses include appropriate modules on multicultural teaching and learning and instructional technology.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Sections of EDUC 737 that focus on college level teaching qualify for the certificate. Sections that focus on higher ed administration, K-12 teaching, or other topics do not qualify. Prior to taking EDUC737 to fulfill requirement B, please send the syllabus and reading list to UMGraduateTeacherCertificate@umich.edu to request approval of the section you intend to take.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup>Workshops focusing only on basic functionality of hardware or software rather than applications for teaching and learning do not satisfy the instructional technology requirement. Sessions at CRLT's October Preparing Future Faculty Conference do not satisfy requirement B2, because they do not explicitly focus on the development of teaching skills.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup>Participation in the U-M Graduate Teacher Certificate Program does NOT guarantee one a GSI appointment. Graduate students who cannot complete a second term of teaching as a GSI, for whatever reason, may petition the U-M Graduate Teacher Certificate Advisory Committee (UMGraduateTeacherCertificate@umich.edu) to complete 2 of the 3 items under Requirement B in lieu of a second term of teaching. <sup>5</sup>Consultations may be provided by a CRLT-trained consultant OR faculty member OR Graduate Student Mentor from the discipline of the GSI appointment.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup>This requirement can be fulfilled by completion of ELI584, with approval of CRLT and instructor.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup>A CRLT-trained consultant will be assigned to evaluate teaching philosophy statements based on criteria specified by the program. If necessary, to satisfy the criteria, participants may resubmit revisions of their teaching philosophy.
