Chiron Graves, Assistant Professor, Department of Biology, Eastern Michigan University

Dr. Graves received his Ph.D. from the University of Michigan and his M.A. and B.S. from Xavier University of Louisiana. Prior to studying at U-M, he taught at Champaign Centennial High School from 2004-2005 and at Jefferson Middle School from 2002-2004, both in Illinois. At EMU, Dr. Graves teaches courses on Life Science for Elementary Teachers and Methods for Teaching Secondary Biology. In his research, he explores conceptual understandings of the "nature of science" (NOS) that are held by science teachers and how their views influence the extent to which they incorporate inquiry-based teaching practices into their classrooms. He is also interested in how teacher experiences in research laboratories impact their conceptual understandings of NOS.

Cyndee Gruden, Associate Professor, Department of Civil Engineering, University of Toledo

Dr. Gruden received her Ph.D. in Civil Engineering from the University of Colorado, and a M.S. and B.S. in Civil Engineering from the University of New Hampshire. Prior to coming to University of Toledo, she was a postdoctoral researcher in environmental water resources engineering at the University of Michigan. Her teaching includes courses on fluid mechanics, water supply and treatment, wastewater engineering, environmental research methods, and capstone design. Her current research interests include sediment remediation and restoration with an emphasis on *in situ* approaches as a viable alternative to dredging, as well as microbial sensing (i.e., quantification, physiological assessment, identification) in environmental systems. Dr. Gruden is Case Western Reserve University's NSF ADVANCE Grant, designed to foster gender equity in STEM faculty careers.

Bob Megginson, Arthur F. Thurnau Professor, Department of Mathematics, University of Michigan

Dr. Megginson received a B.S. in physics from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and he spent the next eight years as a computer systems software specialist for Roper Corporation, a manufacturer of home appliances and lawn care equipment based in Kankakee, Illinois. After returning to the University of Illinois for graduate work, he received his A.M. in statistics and a Ph.D. in mathematics. He then spent nine years on the mathematics faculty of Eastern Illinois University in Charleston before joining the University of Michigan faculty. From 2002-2004, he served as Deputy Director at the Mathematical Sciences Research Institute in Berkeley, California. Until last year, Dr. Megginson was Associate Dean for Undergraduate and Graduate Education for the College of Literature, Science, and the Arts at the University of Michigan. He has been very involved in the problems of minority mathematics education, especially that of Native Americans, and he is a Sequoyah Fellow of the American Indian Science and Engineering Society.
