#### Why Use an Exit Survey?

- LSA Psychology adopted the Senior Exit Survey in 2007 and used it in '08 and '09
- Main purposes are to:
  - see if the needs and desires of students are being met
  - find out students' views and use of the Academic Advising Program
  - monitor changes in students over time

#### What Results do We Have?

- Results presented here are from 2007 and 2008
- About 40% of Psychology graduates responded to the survey each year
- 79% of the 2008 graduate participants will be surveyed again in five years since they indicated that they were willing to engage in a follow-up

#### **What Have We Learned?**

- Students are generally happy with accessibility of G.S.I.'s
- They want smaller classes
- They like the Academic Advising system
- About half have a g.p.a. of 3.2 or higher
- 70% of them worked part time during college
- 70% did research with faculty and over half received credit for research independent study
- About 44% plan to pursue professional school in medicine, business, or law
- About 45% plan to pursue graduate school in psychology, social work, public health, or education
- About 30% plan to eventually find employment in the science/technology/research-related areas, followed by:
  - · 28% in social service or non-profit
  - 17% in marketing, sales, or business
  - 12% in K-12 education

## Psychology Department Modifications Resulting from Survey

- Expanded career counseling and formed a partnership with the Career Center
- Provided increased advising for honors
- Offered more sections of upper-level courses so that each will have fewer students
- Added the Peer Advising Program
